PHARMACY VENDING MACHINES

Locations

- **WALC:** first floor by other vending machines (under stairs)
- **CoRec:** past the Fuel market
- **FORD:** in front of the dining court
- **HILLENBRAND:** in front of the dining court
- **LILLY:** first floor by other vending machines
- **BEERING:** near the entrance
- **EARHART:** located with other vending machines in building lobby, above dining
- **STEWART CENTER:** lower-level walkway between STEW/HICKS

Machines accept both cash and credit card

What's in the machine?

- FREE Covid testing kits
- FREE tampons and pads
- Family planning items: emergency contraception, pregnancy tests, condoms, lubrication
- Cold/Flu remedies: cough drops, medications
- Personal care items: deodorant, toothbrush and toothpaste, mouthwash, Kleenex, Chapstick
- Other over-the-counter pharmacy items
- All items are frequently sold within the Purdue University Pharmacy

Why is this important?

- This is an evidence-based student-led initiative, grounded in research, led by the Interdisciplinary Women's Reproductive Health Collaborative and Purdue University Pharmacy!
- 24/7 access to affordable, reliable, and discrete pharmacy items
- Reduces purchase embarrassment of some sensitive and taboo personal care items
- Among the first Universities, including within the BigTen, to implement pharmacy vending machines

FREE TAMPONS & PADS

Locations

- All restrooms in campus buildings (women's, men's, gender neutral)
- In all Pharmacy Vending Machines on campus:
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What's in the dispensers?

- Tampax Tampons with cardboard applicator
- Kotex Pads without wings

Why is this important?

- Reduces period poverty by increasing access in our campus community
- Free menstruation product availability may mitigate social stigma by providing a streamlined and discrete process for people who menstruate to acquire products they need without experiencing negative social consequences
