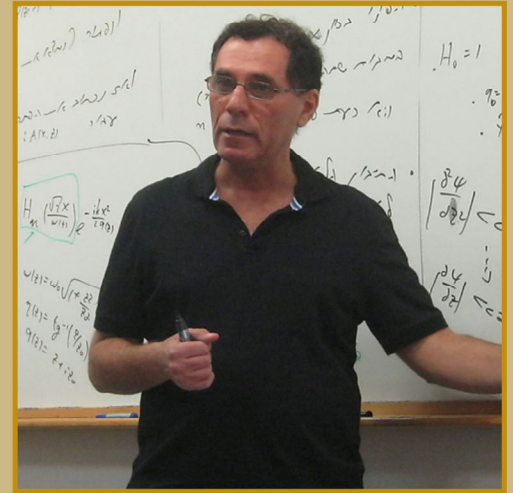

Mordechai(Moti) Segev is the Robert J. Shillman Distinguished Professor of Physics, at the Technion, Israel. He received his BSc and PhD from the Technion in 1985 and 1990. He joined Princeton as Assistant Professor in 1994 and became Professor in 1999. Then Moti went back to Israel and was appointed as Distinguished Professor in 2009.

Moti's interests are mainly in nonlinear optics, photonics, solitons, sub-wavelength imaging, lasers, quantum simulators and quantum electronics, although he finds entertainment in more demanding fields such as basketball and hiking. He has won numerous international awards, including the 2007 Quantum Electronics Prize of the European Physics Society, the 2009 Max Born Award of the Optical Society of America, and the 2014 Arthur Schawlow Prize of the American Physical Society. He was elected to the Israel Academy of Sciences and Humanities in 2011 and the National Academy of Science of the United States in 2015. Moti has also won the Israel Prize in Physics and Chemistry (highest honor in Israel) in 2014 and the EMET Prize (Israel) in 2019.
