SSP Update!

On June 23 - June 28, 2019, Mentoring@Purdue (M@P) hosted its 6th annual Mentoring@Purdue Summer Scholars Program participants from nine 1890 Historically Black Land-Grant Universities, and this year we also welcomed our first Hispanic Serving Institution. The students were selected through an application process that demonstrated evidence of their academic and research accomplishments as well as future scholastic pursuits. The students were provided with a scholarship that covered the cost of travel, hotel accommodations, and meals. The M@P-SSP consisted of activities including workshops on completing the graduate school application, obtaining internal and external funding, a résumé/CV workshop, and a workshop on the transition from a Minority Serving Institution to a Predominantly White Institution. The scholars visited research facilities, various graduate programs, Mackey Arena, France A. Córdova Recreational Sports Center, and the Black Cultural Center. Scholars also interacted with members of various affinity organizations and participated in extracurricular activities.
