Community of Papachacra,

Thank you kindly for your hospitality and generosity towards us on our recent assessment trip. On our trip, we made several modifications and repairs to your system, including changes to the FPS spring box, which added over 5000 liters per day to your potable water supply. We have also done extensive GPS mapping of your current drinking water supply system and have collected data providing a general overview of your irrigation system.

Because of the complications we have encountered with the recent tree spring project, we no longer have a clearly-defined project with your community; however, we need to hear your input for a different project for the future. We ask that you come together as a community and choose a new project. Please define the scope of the project including the following aspects:

- Goals of project
- Clearly-defined need: either irrigation or potable water
- Who will benefit directly and indirectly, and how?
- Exact spring location and owner
- Time frame: start and end date
- Possible negative impacts
- Your expectations of the obligations of Papachacra and those of EWB

We require that this project benefit the entire community. For example, the potable water project incorporating the tree spring into the system benefited the whole community, whereas a small irrigation project may benefit only a few households, and could cause feelings of inequality throughout the community.

It is vital that you come to a conclusion and respond in a written document by **Nov. 30, 2012**. This document must clearly address all points listed above and be received by EIA prior to the required date. Before we are able to begin work on a new project, we will require Papachacra to make an official community investment prior to implementation. Thank you again for your time and considerations. We look forward to continuing to work with Papachacra in the future.
